

The Blues Foundation's Generation Blues Education Grant FY 2025-2026

The Blues Foundation (TBF) is committed to working in partnership with qualified Affiliates and Arts Organizations to expand appreciation of blues music and its history by providing structured educational programming to young people. TBF will offer a limited number of competitive Generation Blues Education Grants to Affiliate organizations and Arts Organizations whose multidisciplinary, experiential blues education programs present the historical context of early blues music, underscore the contemporary relevance of the blues, stimulate intellectual advancement, and/or encourage cultural understanding.

Eligible organizations must be 501 (c) (3) tax-exempt and have current membership with The Blues Foundation.

Successful applicants will meet most of the following criteria:

- Identifies educational programming as a primary objective in the Affiliate's or Arts Organization's strategic plan
- Has a confirmed partnership with a school, community center, or grassroots organization
- Has a written education plan that includes clear educational objectives
- Engages underserved populations (defined as communities of color, low-moderate income, rural, and urban communities)
- Confirmed Child Protection clearances and required background checks
